The institute is planning to go for Annual Maintenance Contract with private service providers. d) Other infrastructural issues such as power supply, electric connections, water supply, computers and printers go under checking and verification time to time, especially before the examinations. e) To assure long lasting infrastructure especially for computers and others instruments Air- conditioners have been installed in the Principal's chamber, Teachers' Room, IQAC room, office, seminar room and smart room. Installation of Air- conditioners in all laboratories is being considered. f) Stabilization systems are targeted to be placed in most of the laboratories while the desktops obviously have supply from UPS. g) Instruments and equipments are upgraded from time to time in accordance with the changing requirements. h) Any problem or issues observed are promptly taken to the notice of the authority and immediate measures are taken. The Finance Committee of the college meets on regular basis and discusses at length the apt measures to be taken for optimum allocation and utilization of financial resources (i.e. college-funds, grants from State Government, UGC etc.). The committee constantly keeps a track of the construction work, renovations and the maintenance needs of equipments including the computers.
