BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Principal Prasanta Kumar Bose, the illustrious and worthy son of Acharya Girish Chandra Bose, founder of Bangabasi College, an eminent educationist of Bengal, founded the Morning section of the Bangabasi College for the needy employed students in 1940 to teach Commerce.

In 1944 Principal Bose opened up the Arts and Science faculties in the evening time. Finally employed women were also enrolled as students by Principal Bose. Through the introduction of the Phase Reduction Scheme of the University Grants Commission, Bangabasi Morning College came into a separate existence on 11 April, 1965; under the guidance and direction of Principal Prasanta Kumar Bose. At that time there were ten thousand students in Bangabasi College, but the number of students in the colleges of West Bengal had to be reduced as per the University Grants Commission scheme. In accordance with the Scheme, Bangabasi College was split up into three seperate colleges. The morning shift was named Bangabasi Morning College under a separate Governing Body. During the Second World Wara branch of the Bangabasi College was established in Kushtia (now in Bangladesh) in 1942, as the people of Kolkata were troubled by the bombing of Japanese troops. After the Second World War it was closed.

Bangabasi Morning College is located in the vicinity of Sealdah Station in Kolkata. Bangabasi College is an educational institution with a rich cultural tradition in its background. It had its genesis in the prophetic vision and spirit of sacrificial dedication of Acharya Girish Chandra Bose. At the outset, Bangabasi College was founded under private management in 1887 and had as its guiding inspiration the genius of Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar. The aim of the college was basically two-fold-to cater to the growing demand for higher education and to nurture the spirit of nationalism in the minds of young learners under colonical yoke. It marked an indirect protest-challenging the narrow educational policy of the Hunter Commission.


This institution seminally emerged from Bangabasi School, founded by Acharya Girish Chandra Bose in 1855 in Bowbazar Street. The college moved into its present premises at 19, Scott Lane (now Raj Kumar Chakraborty Sarani) in 1903.

The College derived its name from the then patriotic newspaper Bangabasi. Acharya Girish Chandra Bose, a man of astounding personality and foresight, filled with a missionary zeal of patriotic reverberation, planted this sapling at 16, Bowbazar Street on 1 June, 1887, with only five teachers and twelve students. The sapling withstood the storms and stresses of the decades and now like a very big banyan tree gives shade and extends shelter to several thousand students of merit and ability, hundreds of teachers and with real integrity and acquisition and many non-teachers of admirable efficiency. The college has a composite amalgum of academics and student community.

During the days of alien rule the Institution served as a refuge for political sufferers students as well as teachers. The nationalist spirit nurtured by the College was amply evident in the active participation of students and teachers in the agitation against the partition of Bengal in 1905 and also in the Civil Disobedience Movement culminating in the supreme sacrifice of martyr Jatindra Nath Das, an undergraduate student of the college, in his epic fast for unto death in Lahore Jail on 13 September, 1929.

Some of the illustrious teachers of this College such as Ladly Mohan Mitra and Satyananda Roy, were the pioneers to extend the facilities of higher education to the toiling mass of the working students who were compelled to engage themselves in different jobs in the day-time and were deprived of college education, by opening the morning classes under the banner of Bangabasi Morning College.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE COLLEGE

Since its inception, Bangabasi Morning College has embarked on the task of instilling a value-based nationalistic knowledge-base along with scientific understanding. Disseminating knowledge in society by this holistic and futuristic model of education as conceived by its illustrious founder Acharya Girish Chandra Bose has been the primary mission of this Institution. Throughout its history Bangabasi Morning College has dedicated itself to the cause of the poor and underprivileged students. It is still continuing this mission by arranging scholarships, stipends from different agencies and by granting free and subsidised studentship and financial support to the poor and meritorious students from the Students' Aid Fund of the College. Being morning college, this Institution is serving another social need, that is extending the educational opportunities to the students who are engaged in different jobs in various parts of the city of Kolkata and its outskirts during the daytime. In fact, the main aim of this college has always been to provide educational opportunities to the poor, underprivileged and in-service students, a substantial proportion of whom are first-generation learners. Although the college does not have the requisite authority to design the curricula, the teachers are always keen to handle the different parts of the syllabi flexibly according the needs of the learners. The College has wide-ranging courses from almost all the major streams to offer to its students. Keeping in mind to the local, regional and national needs the College has, from time to time introduced a range of new courses and upgraded the existing courses so that the students are exposed to the changing needs of our society. The College also regularly seeks peer reviews from different academicians and re-orients its activities as and when some valuable suggestions for change come. Bangabasi Morning College is whole-heartedly dedicated to the all-round development of personality of all its students by imparting a value-based, liberal, modern and self-reliant education.

ACHIEVEMENTS

Affiliated to the University of Calcutta in accordance with the 2(f) and 12(b) clauses of the University Grants Commission, Bangabasi Morning College is still a great example of a coeducational Institution during the morning time offering three-year Honours course in different subjects. In its continuing endeavour for imparting education to all its students, including a substantial proportion of first-generation learners, in a simple but effective manner the college has made its mark as one of the premier academic institutions in the state of West Bengal. Its contribution in extending frontiers of socially significant knowledge is well-manifested through its illustrious alumni as many of its ex-students hold key positions in various fields both within the country and Many eminent educationists, ministers, Policy-makers, doctors, technocrats, bureaucrats and social workers have graduated from this College. This College is now making a special effort for placement of students at the end of college-life. Thus, we have recently introduced self-financing courses and are planning to open more in the near future. The College is committed to providing an education that is consistent with the needs of an evolving knowledge-based society.

It is to be mentioned with pride that our College has been re-accredited with "A" grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in December 2016.

SCALING NEW HEIGHTS

Given the paucity of space and limitations of time imposed by the dynamics of running three colleges in the same building, we are held back from increasing hours of teaching -learning and expanding infrastructural facilities/components at virtually every turn. Such constraints can potentially have a stagnating effect on the institution in the long run, especially resources cannot be made satisfactorily available to supplementhuman

resources, however rich, sincere and committed. In December 2016, to our great delight, such apprehensions were dispelled when the entire college fraternity worked

together for re-accreditation by the NAAC Peer Team and earned a much-coveted 'A Grade, a very rare instance for any college which does not have even the building exclusively for itself, not to mention it's much shorter and overlapping time-span. We are proud to say that noteworthy research contributions from faculty members acroos departments and maximum utilization of whatever resources are available for curricular and co-curricular activities alike nave been the essentially enabling factors; they were great and continue to remain instrumental in setting our the aspirations high. If funds from the UGC, recommendations by the NAAC Peer Team and judicious planning on our part cater in synchronicity, a we can certainly raise the bar and achieve-like the 'A' Grade -much more, some of which, even we ourselves cannot foresee now.

MOTTO

The motto inscribed in the emblem of the College upholds the ideals of the Institution. It is taken from the Bhagbadgita:

Bangabasi Morning College a premier educational institute affiliated to the University of Calcutta is located at Sealdah in the heart of the city Kolkata. Regulation relating to Admission for the Four year B.A/B.Sc. Degree Programme Honours and Honourse with Research semester-wise & <u>Three Year B.A./B.Sc. (Multi disciplinary under CCF, 2022) Courses of Studies</u> conducted by the University of Calcutta.

- In exercise of the powers conferred by Section-54 of Calcutta University Act. 1979, the University of Calcutta hereby makes the following Regulations for Four year B.A/B.Sc. Degree Programme Honours and Honourse with Research semester-wise & B.A./ B.Sc. (Multi disciplinary) courses of Studies (under CCF, 2022).
- These shall apply to every <u>student</u> prosecuting the above Courses in this University.
- Notwithstanding anything contained in any other regulations or rules for the time being in force the study for the above Courses shall be guided by these Regulations effective from the Academic Session <u>2023-2024</u>.

1. TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT:

1. These Regulations shall come into force with effect from the academic session 2023-2024

THE REGULATIONS FOR SEMESTER-WISE FOUR YEAR B.A./ B.Sc. DEGREE PROGRAMME (HONOURS & HONOURS WITH RESEARCH) & SEMESTER WISE THREE YEAR B.A./B.Sc.(Multidisciplinary) DEGREE PROGRAMME under CCF, 2022 (CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK), UNIVERSITY OF CALCUTTA.

2. DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME:

- a. SEMESTER WISE FOUR YEAR B.A./B.Sc. DEGREE PROGRAMME (HONOURS & HONOURS WITH RESEARCH)
- b. The B.A./B.Sc. Programme shall be for a minimum duration of Eight (08) (with an exit option after completion of 2nd/4th/6th Semesters) consecutive semesters Six months each, i.e. The odd semester will start ordinarily in the month of July and the even semester in the month of January of every year.
- c. A student prosecuting a regular course of study for semester wise degree course shall have to clear all semesters in all respect within a span of <u>seven years</u> from the year of admission to the particular course and combination, failing which *enrolment of the student shall stand cancelled*.

Explanation: A student already admitted in this course may seek fresh admission with different course/subject combination (with respect Major/Minor subjects)

SEMESTER WISE THREE YEAR B.A./B.Sc. (Multi disciplinary) DEGREE PROGRAMME

a. The B.A./B.Sc. Programme shall be for a minimum duration of six (06) consecutive semesters (with an exit option

after 2nd and 4th) of six months each, i.e. The odd semester will start ordinarily in the month of July and the even semester in the month of January of every year.

b. A student prosecuting a regular course of study for semester wise degree course shall have to clear all semester in all respect within a span of seven years from the year admission to the particular course and combination, failing which enrolment of the student shall cancelled.

Explanation: A student already admitted in this course may seek fresh admission with different course/subject combination (with respect to Core/Minor subjects)

3. APPLICABILITY OF THE REGULATIONS:

- a) These regulations shall be applicable to the students taking admission to the B.A./B.Sc. Course from the academic session 2023-2024
- b) Students who have already successfully completed any U.G. degree earlier are not eligible to take admission into above course.

ADMISSION REGULATIONS:

SEMESTER WISE FOUR YEAR B.A./B.Sc. DEGREE PROGRAMME (HONOURS & HONOURS WITH RESEARCH)

4. A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st year of the B.A./ B.Sc. (Single-Major) Course of Studies provided the candidate has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100 and fulfills the conditions as laid down in clause 5,10,11 and 12.

However, no student shall be allowed to take admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

Explanation: The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating three years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

- 4.(b) Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination of its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not require to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under the University.
- 5. For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the B.A./ B.Sc./ (Single-Major) Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a student. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject "Environmental Science" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

(a) A student taking up Major Course in a subject must have obtained:

i. A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

Or

ii. 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.

Or

- iii. 50% marks in the aggregate when the student has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examinations provided all other clauses are satisfied.
- (b) Students belonging to Reserved Categories taking up Major Course of Study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate or 40% marks in the subject or related subjects at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be.
- (c) Seat Reservation for admission in the first year class of four-year (eight semesters) degree courses of studies shall be guided by the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission), Act,

2013 and the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institution (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014 and Memorandum No. 339-Edn (CS)/OM-74L/2003, dt. 26.05.2023.

SEMESTER WISE THREE YEAR B.A./B.Sc. (Multidisciplinary) DEGREE PROGRAMME.

A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st year of the B.A./B.Sc. (Single-Major) Course of Studies provided the candidate has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100 and fulfills the conditions as laid down in clause 5, 10, 11 and 12

However, no student shall be allowed to take admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

Explanation : The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating three years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination.

- 4.(b) Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination of its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not require to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under the University.
- 5. For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the B.A./B.Sc./ (Multidisciplinary) Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a student. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate narks. However, if the subject "Environmental Science" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

Seat reservation for admission in the first year class of three-year (six semesters) degree courses of studies shall be guided by the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission), Act, 2013 and the West Bengal State Highter Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014 and Memorandum No. 339-Edn (CS)/OM-74L/2023, dt. 26.05.2023.

- 6. ATTENDANCE: SEMESTER WISE FOUR YEAR B.A./B.Sc. DEGREE PROGRAMME (HONOURS & HONOURS WITH RESEARCH) & SEMESTER WISE THREE YEAR B.A./B.Sc. (MULTIDISCIPLINARY) DEGREE PROGRAMME:
- 6.1. A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to sit for the concerned Semester Examinations subject to fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- 6.2. A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to sit for the concerned Semester Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed condonation fees and fulfillment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- 6.3. A student attending less than 60% of the total number of classes* held shall not be allowed to sit for the concerned Semester Examinations and he/she has to take admission to the same Semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester Examination.

*Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes or date of admission, whichever is later.

Explantion: A student who has not been eligible to appear at any Semester-end Examination in terms of Clause 6.3 may take admission to the next higher Semester and appear at such higher Semester-end Examinations. However, such student has to take admission to the concerned Semester, for which the student has been ineligible clause 6.3, in the very next available chance without pursuing any other Semester Course simultaneously.

8. OUTLINE OF CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK (CCF):

SEMESTER WISE FOUR YEAR B.A./B.Sc. DEGREE PROGRAMME (HONOURS & HONOURS WITH RESEARCH)

CATEGORY OF SUBJECTS:

- (A) **Discipline Specific Core Course (DSCC)**: A course, to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core requirement of the Major subject.
- (B) **Minor**: A subject of same broad discipline to be studied by the student with lesser number of courses other than the major subject.
- (C) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) courses are the courses based on the knowledge of languages. There shall be two AEC courses:
 - a) Compulsory English.
 - b) MIL/Alternative English.
 - MIL includes : Bengali, Hindi & Urdu.
- (D) **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** These courses are designed to provide skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing competencies, skills etc. SEC courses are based upon skill enhancement. Student shall study 2 SECs based on Major subjects in 1st and 3rd Semester. In the 2nd Semester the student can study Artificial Intelligence (for Science discipline) or Digital Empowerment (for Humanities & Language discipline) or as specified in the syllabus of the concerned Major subject.
- (E) **Practical/Tutorial**: All courses other than AEC & CVAC will have one Practical / Tutorial. Wherever there is a practical, there will be no Tutorial and vice-versa. Inclusion of P/TU components in SECs will be decided by the concerned UGBOS.
- (F) Common Value Added Course (CVAC): These courses are based on Knowledge of Human & Social Values. There shall be 4 CVAC courses of 2 credits each. In the 1st Semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & one compulsory CVAC in Constitutional Values. In the 2nd Semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & the students shall select the other CVAC from a pool of courses.
- (G) Summer Internship: All the students are required to do one 3 credit Summer Internship at the end of the 2nd or 4th or 6th Semester. Students completing Internship at the end of the 2nd Semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded Certificate of 45 credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 4th Semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded Diploma of 88 credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 6th Semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded three-year Single major Degree of 132 credits.

- (H) Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC): There shall be 3 IDCs of 3 credits each, to be studied in the first 3 Semesters. The students shall take IDC from the different subjects other than the Major and Minor subjects.
- (I) Research / Dissertation:
 - a) Students obtaining CGPA equivalent to 75% marks after successful completion of all the first 6 Semesters may opt for Honours with research Degree Course in the 7th & 8th Semester.
 - b) Students choosing a 4 year Bachelor's degree (Single major with Research course) are required to take up research projects under the guidance of a faculty member. The students shall have to complete the Research in the 7th & 8th Semester of 4 credits and 8 credits respectively (total 12 credits).
 - c) Students pursuing 4-year Single major Degree without Research shall have to take up to 1 additional DSCC (should be a Project work / dissertation & the course will be of 4 credits) in 7th Semester and 2 additional DSCCs (courses are of 4 credits each and at least one should be a Project Report / Seminar) in 8th Semester.

8A. OUTLINE OF CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK (CCF):

Category of Subjects:

SEMESTER WISE THREE YEAR B.A./B.Sc. (Multidisciplinary) DEGREE PROGRAMME.

- (A) Core Course (CC): Courses, to be compulsorily studied by a student as the requirement of Core subjects. In order to make different Multidisciplinary subject combinations, the subjects of all the discipline have been taken together to create 8 smaller Multidisciplinary pools. The student shall select 3 subjects as core subjects taking not more than one subject from each pool.
- (B) Minor: A subject to be studied by the student with lesser number of courses than the two core subjects.
- **(C) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) :** AEC courses are the courses based on the knowledge of languages. There shall be two AEC Courses :
 - a) Compulsory English.
 - b) MIL/Alternative English.
 - MIL includes: Bengali, Hindi & Urdu.
- (D) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): These courses are designed to provide skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing competencies, skills etc. SEC courses are based upon skill enhancement. The students shall study 3 SECs 2 from each of 2 core subjects in 1st and 2nd semester respectively and in 3rd Semester 1 SEC from the Minor subject.
- **(E)** Practical / Tutorial: All courses other than AEC & CVAC will have one Practical / Tutorial. Wherever there is a practical, there will be no Tutorial and vice-versa. P/TU components in SECs will be as mentioned in the syllabus of the respective subject.
- (F) Common Value Added Course (CVAC): These courses are based on Knowledge of Human & Social Values. There shall be 4 CVAC courses of 2 credits each. In the 1st semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & one compulsory CVAC in Constitutional Values. In the 2nd Semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & the students shall select the other CVAC from a pool of courses.
- (G) Summer Internship: All the students are required to do one 3 credits Summer Internship at the end of the 2nd or 4th or 6th Semester. Students completing Internship at the end of the 2nd semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded Certificate of 45 (42+3) credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 4th semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded. Diploma of 88 (85 + 3) credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 6th Semester and after successful completion of all the 6 Semesters will be awarded B.A./B.Sc. Degree of 128 (125+3) credits.
- (H) Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC): There shall be 3 IDCs of 3 credits each, to be studied in the first 3 Semesters. The students shall select IDCs from the subjects other than the concerned core subject & minor, not more than one from the each of the Multidisciplinary pool (clause no. 12)

10. DISCIPLINES

There will be two broad disciplines: i) Science and ii) Humanities & Languages as described in clause no. (8) **TYPES OF SUBJECTS:**

i) **Major Courses:**

All students shall have to take 22 DSCs of one subject. In addition, students who do not qualify or op for "4 year degree course-by research, will have to take three additional courses with provision for project based evaluation (As mentioned in the syllabus of respective subject).

Although the course contents of all minor courses are identical with some major courses of tha subject, the examinations for Major and Minor courses will be conducted separately.

A college shall offer Major Courses only in such subjects in respect of which it has affiliation for Single major courses.

Minor Courses:

Course content to be the same, as Major Courses of a given standard.

A student will have to take 8 Minor Courses from the same broad discipline as the Major excluding the Major subject. Students have to study 4 Minor Courses in the first two years (1 in each semester) and 4 Minor courses in the 3rd year (2 in each semester).

Of the 4 courses in the first two years2 courses have to be taken from one subject (m1) in the 1st and 2nd semesters and 2 courses from the other subject (m2) in the 3rd and 4th semesters. All these course are intended to be at level

The exact Minor courses are specified in the syllabus of respective subjects. For any minor subject the first two minor courses (irrespective of whether it is taught in 1st or 2nd year) will be identical with the first two courses of the corresponding major subject.

^{*}Students who will not pursue Dissertation / Research work then the candidate will have to study additional 1 DSC/Core paper of 4 credits in the 7th Semester & 2 DSC/Core Papers of 4 Credits each in the 8th Semester.

In the third year (semester-5 & 6) two minor subjects in each semester will have to be taken from two different subjects. These courses are of level 200.

A minor course opted for in the 5th semester will have to be selected from among the major course offered in the 3rd semester level (level 200).

Similarly a minor course opted in the 6th semester will have to be selected from among the major courses offered in the 4th semester (level 200).

iii) Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC):

A student will have to opt for three IDCs (one in each of the first three semesters) from a pool of courses offered in the different disciplines. These courses must be different from the major and minor subject.

iv) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC):

SEC courses are based upon skill enhancement. Student shall study 2 SECs based on Major subjects in 1st and 3rd semester, in the 2nd semester the student can study Artificial Intelligence (for Science discipline) or Digital Empowerment (for Humanities & Language discipline) or as specified in the syllabus of the concerned Major subject.

Course structure (Th, P, Tu) and credit distributions (4 TH +0P/TU; 0 TH+4P; 2 TH+2 P/TU; 3 TH+ 1 P/TU) may differ from subject to subject.

Note: There shall be no course containing only Tutorial.

v) Common Value Added Course (CVAC) :

There shall be 4 CVAC courses of 2 credits each. In the 1st semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & one CVAC in Constitutional Values. In the 2nd semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & the students shall select the other CVAC from a pool courses.

Vi) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):

All students shall have to study 4 AEC courses of 2 credits each (one in each of the first 4 semesters). There will be a compulsory AEC, named Compulsory English which shall be studied in the 1st and 2^{nc} semesters and there will be an optional AEC (MIL/ Alt. Eng) to be studied in the 3rd & 4th semesters.

11. NOMENCLATURE OF DEGREES

- 1. Students taking up the Major and the Minor subjects from the Science Discipline shall pursue B.Sc. degree course.
- 2. Students taking up the Major and the Minor subjects from the Humanities & Language Discipline shall pursue B.A. degree course.
- 3. In case the Major & the Minor subjects taken by a student are included in both the discipline (Science and Humanities & Language discipline) the Student shall pursue B.Sc. degree course.

14. Some Special conditions for taking up Major Courses as follows:

- (i) Economics: A Student shall be allowed to take up Major in Economics if the candidate has passed in Mathematics at the H.S. Examination (10+2) conducted by the West Bengal Council of H.S. Education or its equivalent examination in Mathematics/ Business Mathematics/ Applied Mathematics. Students who have passed Business Economics including Business Mathematics in H.S.(10+2) level from West Bengal Council of H.S. Education are also eligible for admission with Economics as the Major subject, students of Economics Major have to take up Mathematics as one of the Minor subject.
- (ii) Mathematics: A student shall be allowed to take up Major in Mathematics if the candidate has passed in Mathematics/Applied Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination. A student who has passed in Business Mathematics is not eligible for admission to the Mathematics Major Course.
- (iii) Chemistry: A student shall be allowed to take-up Major in Chemistry if the candidate has passed in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics at the previous qualifying examination.
- (iv) Bio-Chemistry: A student shall be allowed to take up Major in Bio-Chemistry if the candidate has passed in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Biology/Bio-Technology at the previous qualifying examination.
- * A student of B.Sc. (Major) in Bio-Chemistry shall have to take-up elective subjects as stated hereunder and inconformity with Grouping of Subjects:
 - (a) Any one of the subjects: Physics/ Mathematics/ Statistics
 - (b) Any one of the subjects: Zoology/ Botany/ Microbiology/ Physiology/ Molecular-Biology.
- (v) <u>Micro-Biology:</u> A student shall be allowed to take-up Major in Micro Biology if the candidate has passed in Chemistry in the previous qualifying Examination.
- *Subject combination for Micro-Biology: Chemistry and any one of the following subjects:
 - Mathematics/Physics/Computer Science/Botany/Zoology/Physiology.
- (vi) Physiology: A student shall be allowed to take-up Major in Physiology if the candidate has passed the subject

- Physiology/Biology/Bio-Technology and Chemistry in the previous qualifying Examination. The subject Biology/Bio-Technology may be treated as the related subject.
- (vii) <u>Food and Nutrition</u>: A student shall be allowed to take-up Major in Food and Nutrition if the candidate has passed in Chemistry at the previous qualifying examination and to take up Chemistry as one of the Minor subjects.
- (viii) Anthropology: A students shall not be allowed to take-up Anthropology (Major) along with Sociology.
- (ix) Environmental Science: Students have to take up Chemistry as one of the Minor subjects.
- (x) <u>Computer Science</u>: The combination of subject for Computer Science Major Course shall be Mathematics as one of the Minor subjects and any one of the subjects: either Physics or Statistics or Electronics as the other Minor subject.
- (xi) <u>Education</u>: If the student has not studied Education as a subject in the previous qualifying examination then Psychology/ Philosophy/ Mathematics/ Sociology/ Economics/ Political Science/ History/ Statistics/ Physics / Chemistry/Biology be treated as related subjects.
- (xii) **Philosophy**: If the students has not studied Philosophy as a subject in the previous qualifying examination then Psychology/ Math/ Education/ Sociology/ Political Science be treated as related subjects
- (xii) **Sociology**: Students passed the previous qualifying examination (10+2) in Science/ Humanities/ Arts (except Commerce) stream with any subject will be allowed to get admission in Sociology-Major.

15. DISCIPLINES

There will be two broad disciplines: Humanities, Science and Home Science, as described in clause no. (7)

TYPES OF SUBJECTS:

i) Core Courses:

All students shall have to take 16 (sixteen) Core Courses from 2 (two) subjects taking 8 (eight) from each core subjects.

ii) Minor Courses:

A subject to be studied by the student, with lesser number of courses other than the two core subjects. All students shall have to study 6 (six) courses from Minor subject.

iii) Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC):

A student will have to opt for three IDCs (one in each of the first three semesters) from a pool of subjects offered by the different disciplines. These courses must be different from the major and minor subjects core.

iv) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC):

SEC courses are based upon skill enhancement. The Students shall study 3 SECs 1 from each 2 core and 1 minor subject taken.

Course structure (Th, P, Tu) and credit distributions (4 TH +0P/TU; 0 TH+4P; 2 TH+2 P/TU; 3 TH+ 1 P/TU) may differ from subject to subject.

Note: There shall be no course containing only Tutorial.

v) Common Value Added Course (CVAC) :

There shall be 4 CVAC courses of 2 credits each. In the 1st semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & one CVAC in Constitutional Values. In the 2nd semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & the students shall select the other CVAC from a pool of courses.

Vi) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):

All students shall have to study 4 AEC courses of 2 credits each (one in each of the first 4 semesters). There will be a compulsory AEC, named Compulsory English which shall be studied in the 1st and 2^{nc} semesters and there will be an optional AEC (MIL/ Alt. Eng) to be studied in the 3rd & 4th semesters.

Nomenclature of Degree :

A student taking up Multidisciplinary Courses of Studies for the B.A. Degree shall study:

i) Both the core subjects and the minor subject from the Humanities discipline.

or

ii) Any two of the three subjects (two core and one minor subjects) from the Humanities Discipline and the other from the Science/ Home Science discipline

A student taking up Multidisciplinary Courses of Studies for the B.Sc. Degree shall study:

i) Both the core subjects and the minor subject from the Science / Home Science discipline.

or

ii) Any two of the three subjects (two core and one minor subjects) from the Science / Home Science discipline and the other from the Humanities discipline.

Regulation relating to Admission for the semester-wise Four-Year B.Com. Honours or Honours with Research / Three-Year B.Com (under CCF, 2022) Courses of Studies conducted by the University of Calcutta.

- In exercise of the powers conferred by Section-54 of Calcutta University Act. 1979, the University of Calcutta hereby makes the following Regulations for <u>Four-Year B.Com. Honours or Honours with Research / Three Year B.Com courses of Studies (under CCF, 2022).</u>
- These shall apply to every **student** prosecuting the above Courses in this University.
- Notwithstanding anything contained in any other regulations or rules for the time being in force the study for the above Courses shall be guided by these Regulations effective from the Academic Session 2023-2024.

1. TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT:

- 1.1 These Regulations shall be called **THE REGULATIONS FOR SEMESTER WISE Four-Year B.Com. Honours or**Honours with Research / Three-Year B.ComDearee Programme under CCF (CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK). UNIVERSITY OF CALCUTTA.
- 1.2 These Regulation shall come into force with effect from the academic session 2023-2024.

2. DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME:

The Four-year B.Com.Honours/ Honours with Research Programme shall be for a minimum duration of eight (08) (with an exit option after completion of 2nd/4th/6th semester) consecutive semesters of six months each, i.e. The odd semester will start ordinarily in the month of July and the even semester in the month of January of every year.

Three-year B,Com. Programme shall be for a duration of six (with an exit option after completion of 2nd/4th semester) consecutive semesters of six months each, i.e. The odd semester will start ordinarily in the month of July and the even semester in the month of January of every year.

A candidate prosecuting a regular course of study for semester wise degree course shall have to clear all semesters in all respect within a span of <u>seven years</u> from the year of admission to the particular course and combination, failing which *enrolment of the candidate shall stand cancelled*.

Explanation: A student already admitted in this course may seek fresh admission with different course subject to clause no 4.

3. APPLICABILITY OF THE REGULATIONS:

- a) These regulations shall be applicable to the students taking admission to the B.Com. (Four-Year B.Com. Honours with Research / Three-Year B.Com Degree) Course from the academic session 2023-2024.
- b) Students who have already successfully completed any U.G. degree earlier are not eligible to take admission into above course.

I-ADMISSION REGULATIONS

4.(a) A candidate who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st year of the Four-Year B.Com. Honours or Honours with Research / Three-Year B.Com Degree Course of Studies provided he/she has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100 and fulfills the conditions as laid down in clause **5,10,11** and **12**.

Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Vocational Examination in Business and Commerce conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training shall be eligible to seek admission to the first year of the three-year B.Com course of studies under this University.

However, no candidate shall be allowed to take admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

(**Explanation**: The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating three years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination).

- **4.(b)** Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not require to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.
- 5. For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the Four-Year B.Com. Honours or Honours with Research / Three Year B.Com Degree Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a candidate. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject "Environmental Science" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.
- (a) A student taking up Four-Year B.Com. Honours or Honours with Research Course of study in a subject must have obtained:
 - i) A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or **related subject** at the previous qualifying examination.

Or

- ii) 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.
- (b) However, students belonging to the scheduled caste or scheduled tribe community taking up 4-year honours course of study must have obtained a minimum of 40% marks in the aggregate or 40% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination, as the case may be.
- (c) Related subjects: Accountancy, Business Economics including Business Mathematics, Business Organization, Mathematics, Business Mathematics, Economics, Statistics, Business Studies, Office & Secretarial practice Financial Accounting, Elements of Cost Accountancy and Auditing, Book keeping, Commerce, Cost Accountancy and Principles of Management, Commercial Law and Preliminaries of Auditing, Costing & Taxation.
- (d) A student taking up three-year B.Com course of study must fulfil eligibility conditions stated in clause no. 4 (a) only of the regulation.
- (e) Seat reservation for admission in the first year class of four-yearHonours (eight semesters)/ Three-year (six semesters) B.Com. courses of studies shall be guided by the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions Reservation in Admission), Act, 2013 and the West Bengal State Higher Educational Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Rules, 2014 and Memorandum No. 339-Edn (CS)/OM-74L/2023, dt.26.05.2023.
- 6. Outline of CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK (CCF):
 Category of Subjects:
- A) Discipline Specific Core Course (DSCC)/ Major: A course, to be compulsorily studied by a student.
- B) **Minor**: A subject to be studied by the student with lesser number of courses than the major subject and to be chosen from a pool of subjects.
 - B) **AEC**: AEC courses are the courses based on the knowledge of languages. There shall be two AEC courses:
 - a) Compulsory English
 - b) MIL/Alternative English
 - MIL includes : Bengali, Hindi & Urdu.
- C) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): These courses are designed to provide skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing competencies, skills etc. SEC courses are based upon skill enhancement.
- D) Practical / Tutorial: All courses other than AEC & CVAC will have one Practical / Tutorial. Wherever there is a practical, there will be no Tutorial and vice-versa. Inclusion of P/TU components in SECs will be decided by the concerned UGBOS.
- E) CVAC (Common Value Added Course): These courses are based on Knowledge of Human & Social Values.

 There shall be 4 CVAC courses of 2 credits each. In the 1st semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & one compulsory CVAC in Constitutional Values. In the 2nd semester there shall be 1 compulsory CVAC in ENVS & the students shall select the other CVAC from a pool of courses.
- F) Summer Internship: All the students are required to do one3 credits Summer Internship at the end of the 2nd or 4th or 6th semester. Students completing Internship at the end of the 2nd semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded Certificate of 45 credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 4th semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded Diploma of 88 credits. Students completing Internship at the end of the 6th semester will be allowed to take exit from the course and will be awarded three-year B.Com. Honours/ three-year B.Com. Degree of 128 credits.

- G) Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC): There shall be 3 IDCs of 3 credits each, to be studied in the first 3 semesters. H) Research/Dissertation:
 - a) Students obtaining CGPA equivalent to 75% marks after successful completion of all the first six semesters may opt for B.Com. Honours with research degree course in the 7th and 8th semesters. Students choosing a 4-year B.Com.degree (Honours with Research) are required to take up research projects under the guidance of a faculty member. The students shall have to complete the Research in the 7th& 8th semester of 4credits and 8 credits respectively (total 12 credits).
 - b) Students pursuing 4-year Honours Degree without Research shall have to take up 1 additional DSCC on Research Methodology of 4 credits inthe7th semester and 2 additional DSCCs (courses are of 4 credits each) -- one shall be a Project Report and the other is theoretical course to be chosen from a pool of courses in the 8th semester.

GENERAL INFORMATION

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE:

Each student is provided with an identity Card with his/her photograph attested by the Principal or the College. This is an important document and should be carefully preserved. Students must come to the College with their College identity Card which they should produce on demand. In case of loss, a student shall have to make an FIR with the Local Police Station and apply to the Principal with the FIR number for a duplicate identity Card which may be issued on payment of Rs. 50 only.

Every student must see the college Notice Board every day to keep, himself/herself properly informed through various notices issued by the College from time to time; ignorance of any fact circulated through any notice for reasons of non-perusal of the notice on the part of any student, for whatever grounds, shall not entitle him to any special treatment.

Misbehavior with teachers and members of the staff is a serious offence and may lead to the expulsion of the offender.

Any discourtesy towards girl-students shall be severely punished; it may even lead to expulsion of the college.

Outsiders are not permitted within the College premises and students must not bring outsiders to the college for any reason.

Shouting inside the College is not permitted.

Loitering in the corridor, disturbing classes, copying in examinations, are treated as misconduct and breach of discipline may warrant punitive action.

Students are to maintain discipline inside and outside the College. Smoking in the College Verandahs, Common Rooms, Lawns, and Class Rooms is strictly prohibited.

ATTENDANCE:

Name of students absent from the college for a period of over 30 days without any written intimation are liable to be struck off the rolls.

It is compulsory for all students to appear for all college tests and examinations and score the requisite pass marks, along with necessary class attendance, in order to be promoted to the next higher class.

A candidate shall be considered as Collegiate if he/she has attended 75% or above lectures delivered/practical classes held in each of the subjects/group of subjects and as Non-collegiate if attendance in any subject / group of subjects falls short of 75% but not below 60%. Candidates declared Non-collegiate may be allowed to fill in application forms for examination on payment of requisite Non-collegiate fees. A candidate who has not attended at least 60% of lectures delivered/practical classes held in any subject/ group of subjects shall be considered as discollegiate and shall be debarred from appearing in the University Final Examination.

Students are advised to abide by the following rules and regulations of the College very carefully. These are strictly followed. Under no circumstances will pleading ignorance or violation of these rules be considered as a valid excuse.

As loitering in the corridors is strictly prohibited during free periods, students should go to the Common Room or Library Reading Room and utilize the leisure as best as they can.

Students must not enter the Professors' Lounge or the Principal's Room without permission. Regular attendance in classes and in Monthly, Half-Yearly and Annual Examination is compulsory. All fees must be paid through the Fee Book issued to the Students by the College authorities. Fees once paid are not-refundable.

The Fee Book and the Library Card must be preserved carefully. Loss of any of these will entail a fine of Rs. 20/-

All payments should always be made in cash at the Bank of Baroda, Sealdah Branch only against a receipt in the proper printed form.

Application for a refund of the Library or Laboratory Deposit must always be accompanied by the corresponding Deposit Voucher of the Fee Book.

The amount of the Laboratory or Library Deposit is refunded after necessary deductions when students finally leave the College.

Tuition Fees for every month must be paid in advance within the 20th of the months unless otherwise notified. A fine of Rs. 20/- per month is charged for delay in payment of fees. Names of the defaulters for three consecutive months are struck off the College Rolls. For restoration they will have to clear all the dues with a fine of Rs 10/-.

Students desiring to take Transfer Certificate within the academic year, will have to pay all College dues for the whole session along with the Transfer Fee which is equivalent to one month's Tuition Fees. Transfer Certificate cannot be issued to students migrating from any other University or Board unless they are registered in Calcutta University. Frequent change of subjects is not allowed [in any case]. The intended change may be allowed once only within a month from the date of commencement of classes. Students must always keep in mind that it is their prime duty to keep the college compound clean. Writing on the walls must be ad voided in all cases.

Students must not enter or leave a class without the permission of the teacher.

When a teacher is absent, students must maintain discipline among themselves so that other classes may continue peacefully.

Should any college property be damaged in the class rooms the loss may be recovered by a fine imposed upon the whole class, if the student/students responsible for such damage cannot be detected.

All applications shall be sent through the office and not directly to the Principal.

Applications from the students are received daily upto 11 a.m. in the office on the first floor.

Appearance in classes is the imperative duty of a student. To appear in the examination as a Collegiate Student, one shall have to keep 75% of attendance. A student whose percentage of attendance is below 75% but above 60% shall have to pay RS. 400/- to the University of

Calcutta and appear as a Non-Collegiate student. Students having a percentage of attendance below 60% are r eligible to sit for the University Examination.

Sports and games:

There are arrangements for indoor and outdoor sports and games - under the guidance of a Teacher-n charge of games and sports and an experienced coach. The College has a playground of its own in the Kolkata Maidan and a beautiful pavilion- the first pavilion in the Maidan for any college of Kolkata.

Library:

The College has a Library with a large number of rare books. Facilities of UGC and Text Book Libraries are also available. The present Reading Room has the prospect of expansion for larger accommodations. There is a spacious Reading Room in the Library for the use of students to enable them in their reference work. Computerization is being undertaken. The classification and cataloguing of books are done according to D D C (Dewy Decimal Classification) and AACR2 (Anglo American Catalogueing Rules). The College Library consists of a rich collection of rare books, journals, and periodicals which include the latest publications on various subjects. Internet facility is available for the students and teachers.

Central Library was established in order to meet the academic and research needs of the Teachers, Research Scholar, the Students and other staff members. The Central Library is computerized with Koha library automation software. The library is member of N-LIST (National Library and Information Services infrastructure for Scholarly Content) consortium of INFLIBNET through the members of the library can access 6300+e-journals and 1,00,000 e-books. There are departmental libraries in each department for the students of concerned departments. Our 24*7 online system & information services available in web based online Public Access Catalogue (webopac).

Common Room:

There are two Common Rooms one for the boys and the other exclusively for the girls. There are arrangements for various indoor games in the common Rooms-table tennis, carrom and chess. This facilitates recreational activities.

Extra-Curricular Activities:

The College encourages the following types of extra-curricular activities of students as a part of college education: Formation of habits in civic responsibility, the broadening of outlook and sympathies through varied associations and cultural development through participation in the intellectual and aesthetic life of the College and society at large.

Students' Council:

It is composed of student-representatives from all classes one member from the teaching faculty as President, teachers as sectional presidents. The College authority encourages the development of a healthy corporate life in the college. Apart from organizing various sociocultutal activities, the Council plays a positive role in furthering the development programs of the Institution.

All students of the College are members of the Students' Council which functions through a Representative Committee elected by the students of different classes. The aim of which is that different communities may mix freely and work in close co-operation with one another in an atmosphere of good will and harmony.

Blood Donation Camps are organized annually by the Union. The Union fosters the growth of a healthy communication among students through various Cultural programmes, sports and seminars, raises funds for social service and relief work, as well as rendering financial help to the poor and deserving students of the College. It is managed by the students under the direction of the teacher who is the President of the College Students' Council. The Students' Council is a vibrant entity in the College.

College Canteen:

The canteen caters various types of fast food and light refreshments and snacks at an affordable price.

Nature Cub and Photography Club:

It provides the scope for establishing harmony between man and nature, which is strengthened by an understanding and commonness of purpose among students, teachers, and non-teaching staff as well as well-wishers of the neighborhood through annually organized tree-plantation.

Introduction:

Every citizen of the country, male and female, enjoys the right to education and employment in an environment of safety and security. The Constitution of India has strived for gender equality since its very inception. The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 ("POSH Act") was enacted by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, India, in the year 2013. In this case, the Court framed certain guidelines, also known as the Vishaka guidelines, relying on the provisions of the Convention on Elimination of All forms of Discrimination against Women ("CEDAW"). University Grants Commission

(UGC) recommends the measures for ensuring the safety of women and programs for gender sensitization on campuses. A Women's Cell in institution symbolizes a safety hub for the students. It is also the sign of progression and open thinking. Vision of the Women's Cell of this college is to promote general well-being of female students, teaching and non-teaching women staff of the College and to provide and maintain a dignified, congenial working environment for women and enable them to explore their imminent potential in all aspects.


